IMPROVEMENTS TO PERIMETER FENCING

Due to concerns identified by the Senior Leadership Team and Governors, Penpol School is having its perimeter fencing updated and replaced.

It was noted that the old fencing was in poor condition, and at numerous points around the site, its deterioration was creating a potential health and safety concern.

The new fencing, which comes with a fifteen-year guarantee and is funded by Cornwall Council, will ensure the safety and wellbeing

of the children, especially when they are playing at break and lunchtimes.

The improved fencing will also ensure the overall security of the school by restricting access and ensuring that visitors can only enter the site via the main office.

The improvements will see a new gate positioned next to the school hall. The old wooden gate leading into the infant playground is also being replaced and a more secure gate put in its place.

We are very fortunate that Penpol School's location sees it situated in a beautiful location, surrounded by fields and wonderful views. With this in mind, the new fencing is designed to blend in with the surrounding environment and we are confident that it will not impede negatively on the overall feel or look of the school.

APPLYING FOR A PLACE IN A RECEPTION CLASS FOR 2017/2018



Applications for places in a Reception class at a primary school for 2017 need to be made **by 15th January 2017 – this is very, very soon!** If you wish your child to be considered for a place at Penpol, please make sure that you have applied before this date. ALL PLACES ARE ALLOCATED BY CORNWALL COUNCIL (not us), so it is really, really important that your application is made in time. If you are in any

ACADEMIC REVIEW DAY - FRIDAY 10TH FEBRUARY

This term, our Academic Review Day will be held on Friday 10th February. (This means the school will be closed for normal lessons on 10th February). This day has proved very successful in the past with many mums and dads able to come in, together with their children, to look at work and discuss progress. Your child will



shortly be bringing home a letter outlining arrangements for Academic Review Day – <u>please return</u> <u>the slip from this letter (one for each child please)</u> indicating the time of day that will be most convenient for you to attend. (The appointments will be for 10 minutes per child). Please may we remind you that on the day, there will be crèche facilities in the hall between 9am and 3pm, where younger siblings can be left while you meet with the class teachers. Your child will need to come with you to see their teacher but they DO NOT need to wear their school uniform on this day.



SPECIAL SCHOOL LUNCH ON THURSDAY 19TH JANUARY

On Thursday 19th January, there will be a change in our usual menu. We will be having a special 'Build Your Own Burger' lunch. SCHOOL DINNER PAYMENTS



Please may we remind you that all Junior children who need to pay for their school dinners, do so very promptly. We are still very pleased to be able to provide the special offer of having Fridays dinner for free if meals have been taken and paid for on Mondays to Thursdays. However, for this scheme to work satisfactorily, **ALL JUNIOR MEALS** need to be paid for in advance or on the day the meal is taken. It is

very time consuming (and sometimes awkward for us and the children themselves) when we have to follow up unpaid meals and we would really appreciate your support with this. (This obviously does not apply if your child is entitled to Free School Meals).

UNWANTED CHRISTMAS GIFTS !!!

In our December newsletter, we asked for any unwanted Christmas Gifts to be donated to school. Those Christmas gifts that you don't really need, want or like!!!
