


PLAY AND LEARN

E-safety Update

There are currently a number of potentially dangerous trends circulating the internet at present, several linked to seemingly innocent sounding characters. We have recently spoken with a number of children who had become curious about these characters and were beginning to explore further. It is impossible to overemphasise the importance of regular, frank and supportive conversations with your child, remembering that whilst they may be the internet experts in the house, you remain the safety experts. Please also ensure that internet privacy and security settings are used on all devices that your child has access to.

A number of children have also reported disagreements related to social media apps. Please remember that there is a lower age limit of thirteen for Snapchat, Twitter, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik, Youtube and Facebook. Use of these apps, particularly if unsupervised, leaves younger children in a very dangerous position.

We will soon be publishing details of further parent/carer workshops for this year which will include a focus upon e-safety. In the meantime, if you have any questions at all, please do not hesitate to ask.

HEADLICE

There have been several reports of headlice throughout school recently. You will appreciate that this is an on-going problem in many primary schools and the only way to remedy the situation is to check your child's hair thoroughly every time it is washed. After shampooing, it is important to use conditioner before combing the hair with a fine toothcomb. If headlice are detected, you may wish to seek advice from the chemist, as



there are treatments available that can help. Due to the very nature of the problem, it is essential that all parents consider other families and ensure that the 'washing and combing' procedure is carried out on a regular basis. Thank you for your help and understanding in this matter.

CHARTWELLS SCHOOL MEAL PACKAGING

As part of their classwork, a number of the Year 6 pupils wrote a persuasive letter to Chartwells our school meal provider about the amount of packaging that they were using. As a result of this, Chartwells have agreed to stop using the individual polystyrene tubs of ice cream for the children and will instead serve ice cream from a large block. This does mean however, we will only be able to serve vanilla instead of the usual choice of chocolate or strawberry as well!
