

Dear Parents/Carers,

JUNIOR CHRISTMAS CAROL CONCERT ARRANGEMENTS

This year our Junior Christmas Carol Service will be held at St Elwyn's Church in Hayle on Thursday 13th December. There will be two services on this day – the first one at 2pm and then the evening performance at 6pm.



The children will come to school as usual on the Thursday and then the teachers and helpers will walk them down to St Elwyn's after lunch in preparation for the service at 2pm. The children will then walk back to school where they can be collected at the usual time. In the evening, please arrange to take your child to the church for 5.45pm - we are expecting the services to last for around three quarters of an hour.

Past experience has shown us that the evening service is always extremely busy with standing-room only on many occasions. Therefore we would encourage any parents/carers who are able, to attend the afternoon service instead of the evening one. This should make things a little more comfortable for everyone.

CORRESPONDENCE BY E-MAIL

PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING

It is important that all families who would be entitled to Free School Meals apply for Pupil Premium Funding. (If you have already done this, thank you so much and no further action is necessary). All Infants are entitled to have a free meal every day, but if any family (Junior or Infant) are on a lower income and would have been entitled to free school meals anyway, it is so very important for you to apply. The process is very straightforward and totally confidential. If you log on to the Cornwall Council website and choose 'Schools' and then 'School Meals' you can type in your details and find out immediately if you are eligible for this funding. If you are not sure how to do this, please call in and see us at the office and we will be able to help you.

It is incredibly important to our school that everyone who is eligible applies – the money is there to be granted but if you do not apply, the school does not receive these extra funds. We also receive extra funding for children if either of the parents are in the forces. If you think this applies to you and we don't know about it, please come in and let us know at the office.
