Activity 1 (English) Play 'Teach your Monster to Read'	Write a postcard or an email for a friend or relative. Remember to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. Challenge – Can you write question sentences and exclamation sentences? Remember?!	Write Stretchy Noun Phrases using adjectives. Adjectives describe the noun (naming word). Remember to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. Try to use commas between the adjectives. E.g. I have a cat. I have a fluffy cat. I have a fluffy, ginger cat.
