Dear All,

Happy new year and welcome back to a new school term! The children have settled back impressively quickly and we have seen a busy week of learning, excitement and exploration across the school.

As you know, **COVID-19** cases continue to rise sharply for the time being and we do expect to see continued absences of both children and staff. Our team are adapting and adjusting as ever to keep things running as smoothly as possible and we continue to work closely with teaching agencies to source additional staff where needed and if available. It is critical that we remain open to all pupils and we will do all that we can to avoid disruption to our provision. Please do check all emails and texts received from us as any urgent messages will be shared through these channels.

Whilst we establish a clearer picture of the COVID situation in our community, we are taking **some additional steps** to reduce indoor mixing of pupils where appropriate. For example, we have delayed the introduction of larger assemblies and buddy reading activities until a little later in the term.
