Forest School

Starting next week, Class 4 will be taking part in Forest School every Monday.

These sessions will be run by Mrs Allen and they will be held at our onsite Forest School.

Forest School is a great opportunity for our children to experience nature and to learn from exploring the outside world in a safe, controlled environment.

Forest School is based on a respect for nature, where children and young people are positively encouraged to create their own learning experiences. Through this, we hope the children will learn resilience and improve their confidence/social skills through a range of woodland activities. These will include shelter building, knot tying, making fires, outdoor cooking, arts and crafts, team games and much more!

It is essential that the children come into school on their designated day wearing weather-appropriate clothing (not school uniform) that can get dirty and wet as it is an all-weather activity. The children should also bring a waterproof coat, waterproof trousers and welly boots, these can be left in school if required.

Farm School

On Monday 6th March will be going offsite to 'Farm School' at Trefewha Farm at Praze an Beeble. We will be leaving school at 12.30, they will have their usual lunch before we leave and will be back to school for usual collection time. We ask for a £1 contribution towards the cost of the mini bus, this can be paid using Parent Pay.

They will need to come to school dressed in their Forest School clothes please (see above).
