
## Penpol School

The children have continued to build on these sparks of creativity with writing fluency sessions, which are now happening during the day. It's a chance for children to write without limits and become authors themselves.





Year 1 visited Trefewha Farm continuing our forest school provision in the community. The children learnt about how horse manure makes a wonderful growing boost for fruit trees and how it needs time to rot into the soil before using. They also fed the horses and helped to spread rotting woodchip onto the newly planted trees – as you can see lots of fun was had by all!

We are extremely lucky to have a dedicted and passionate staff working at Penpol and this also extends to their adventures outside of the school gates. Vicky Burlingham (Miss B) took part in the European Interclub Lifesaving Championships this week and had an incredibly successful cometition. She was one of only two competing from Hayle Surf lifesaving Club. They come 10th overall out of 23 clubs and Vicky won Silver in the board rescue as well as coming 9th in the beach sprint and 8th in the beach flags. This is an incredible achievment and we want to say we are extremely proud of her commitment and success!
