

## **End of 2023 Achievement**

This data is based on teacher assessment submitted to the Local Authority and National tests results which have been externally marked. We are awaiting the validated national averages in some phases and measures for 2023. NCER indicates the National Consortium of Examination Results which are calculated from a large collection of Local Authorities.

#### Progress data: (KS1 to KS2)

Individual progress scores relate to nationally average progress for children from comparable starting points, with '0' representing expected progress. Our overall progress measures were stronger than average, both Cornwall-wide and nationally, in each area. Average scaled scores below, were significantly above national and local averages.

The percentage of children attaining the expected standard in Year 6 compared with national averages is **in line or above in all areas**. In reading and GPS, this is **significantly above** and in writing, maths, RWM and science, it is either slightly above or broadly in line. This attainment in general is particularly more successful when factoring in lower attainers' starting points at Key Stage 1 and the disruption to learning across KS2 due to the pandemic.

The percentage of children attaining the greater depth standard **is above national levels in reading, writing, RWM and GPS.** It is slightly below national averages in maths. However, 5 pupils achieved a scaled score of 109 just missing the 110 required for GDS. GDS standards have risen at Penpol in all areas at KS2 compared to 2022.

Disadvantaged pupils at Penpol are working above disadvantaged peers nationally (2022) in reading, maths, RWM and GPS. We await some national GDS 2023 data for comparison. Our **disadvantaged pupils were above national (others) in reading** this year.

#### Percentage of EYFS pupils attaining a Good Level of Development (GLD):

In 2023, our pupils in Reception attained below their national counterparts in the GLD measure which assesses against expected outcomes across the Prime Areas and in the Specific Areas of maths and literacy. Historically, outcomes in GLD have been above national.

Year 1 phonics scores have been at or above national levels for the last 3 years, showing **rapid and sustained progress since 2019**.

Our KS1 pupils have **improved outcomes in 2023 compared to 2022**. Analysis has shown that pupils have been disproportionately impacted by the pandemic and missing time in school and this was particularly the case with the 2022 cohort. Bespoke intervention and curriculum design has enabled targeting with the 2023 cohort and results show significant improvements. The 2023 cohort were slightly above in reading and writing but below in maths compared to national.

Outcomes for KS1 disadvantaged pupils in 2023 at Penpol were broadly in line or stronger in reading, writing, maths and science compared to disadvantaged nationally. We continue to target provision to improve outcomes for disadvantaged pupils. End of KS2 outcomes evidence that our work to close the gap is proving impactful.

The average score of Y4 pupils was above the national average as well as the percentage of pupils attaining 25/25.
