The children in our Nurture provision have been learning about the wonders of Autumn. They have had first-hand experience of being out and about, creating wonderful artwork and these


inspiring poems.







Year 5 have been enjoying sessions delivered by the "Feeling Good' project. This focus on positivity in mind and body. Where was my invite?!!






